## FORMAT FOR THE 2023 SCHOOL CHESS LEAGUE (SCL)

## General

- \* All zonal tournaments to be completed prior to Monday 28<sup>th</sup> August.
- \* Zonal tournaments will be played on weekends during school term.
- \* There will be four zonal tournaments.
- \* All students who are either enrolled in a WA school, or homeschooling in WA, may participate.
- \* A school must accumulate a total of 10 SCL points from the 4 Zonal tournaments to qualify a team for the SCL Finals (see points allocation below).

## **Zonal Tournaments**

- \* There will be two divisions for each zonal event: a Primary Division and a Secondary Division.
- \* Individual prizes and school prizes will be awarded for each of the Primary Division and Secondary Divisions, at each zonal event.
- \* Trophies will awarded as follows. Separate trophies will be awarded for the Primary and Secondary Divisions. All awards are subject to there being at least 5 eligible players in the category.
  - \* Individual 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, Best Girl
  - \* School trophy to be awarded to the school of the winning team
  - \* School individual trophies to the top 4 players from each the teams placing  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ ,  $3^{rd}$
- \* When players or schools share the same number of points, the tiebreak system specified by the Chief Arbiter will be used to decide the final placings.
- \* Zonal events will be run in a 7 round Swiss format with barred same-school pairings.
- \* The time control will be 15 minutes per player plus 2 seconds increment per move.
- \* Each school's score is the sum of the scores of their top four players.
- \* Schools may participate in as many Zonal events as they wish and may register as many players as they wish in each Zonal event.
- \* Individuals may participate, and their points will count towards their school.
- \* The Chief Arbiter has the right to change the format to accommodate any special issues, e.g., lockdown announcement or limited number of attendees.
- \* Whenever possible, Zonal tournaments will be conducted over the board.
- \* Once a Primary or Secondary school has accumulated 10 points they have earned the right to field a team of four players (plus one reserve) in the WA Schools Chess League Finals, scheduled for Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September.

## **School Points Allocation for Zonal Tournaments**

\* 1<sup>st</sup> place = 12 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place = 10 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> place = 8 points, 4<sup>th</sup> place = 6 points, 5<sup>th</sup> place = 4 points, 6<sup>th</sup> place = 2 points, other = 1 point
